Directions:

From the Intersection of the Thomasville Bypass and Georgia Highway 3 Alternate (Old Ochlocknee Road), proceed in a northerly direction on GA 3 Alternate for 4.1 miles. This highway takes you across Georgia's mighty Ochlocknee River. Soon after crossing the river (as the road curves) you will see warning markers along the right side of the highway. Slow down because the Camp House Entrance is on the right at the last warning marker. The number 22472 is on the end of the fence.

The fence is brownish and so is the gate - but the gate should be open for you.

Come in through the open gate and continue LEFT along the gravel path to the Camp House. Proceed for three-tenths of a mile to the first of two rail crossings. It is not necessary to stop at this first crossing because you turn RIGHT just before the tracks. Proceed one-tenth of a mile to the next rail crossing and turn LEFT. You have arrived!
