We have participated in this program - with money for turkeys or hams and other supplies, and sometimes donating canned goods or oatmeal. This year, we are again providing funding, but we also have opportunities for hands-on participation.

- **Help with Costco Order Pickups:** In past years, Charlie and Anita shopped at Costco, loaded the car and delivered several times a week to the school. This can only happen before or after the lunch period. This year, one or two people with an SUV or truck would be appreciated on any given day that an order is ready,
- **Monday 11/13 at Kingsley:** We could use some help cutting open packages, breaking down boxes and sorting into categories.
- **Thursday 11/16 at Kingsley:** We could use two strong people in the morning, and two in the afternoon to carry well-filled (heavy) harvest baskets to people's cars.

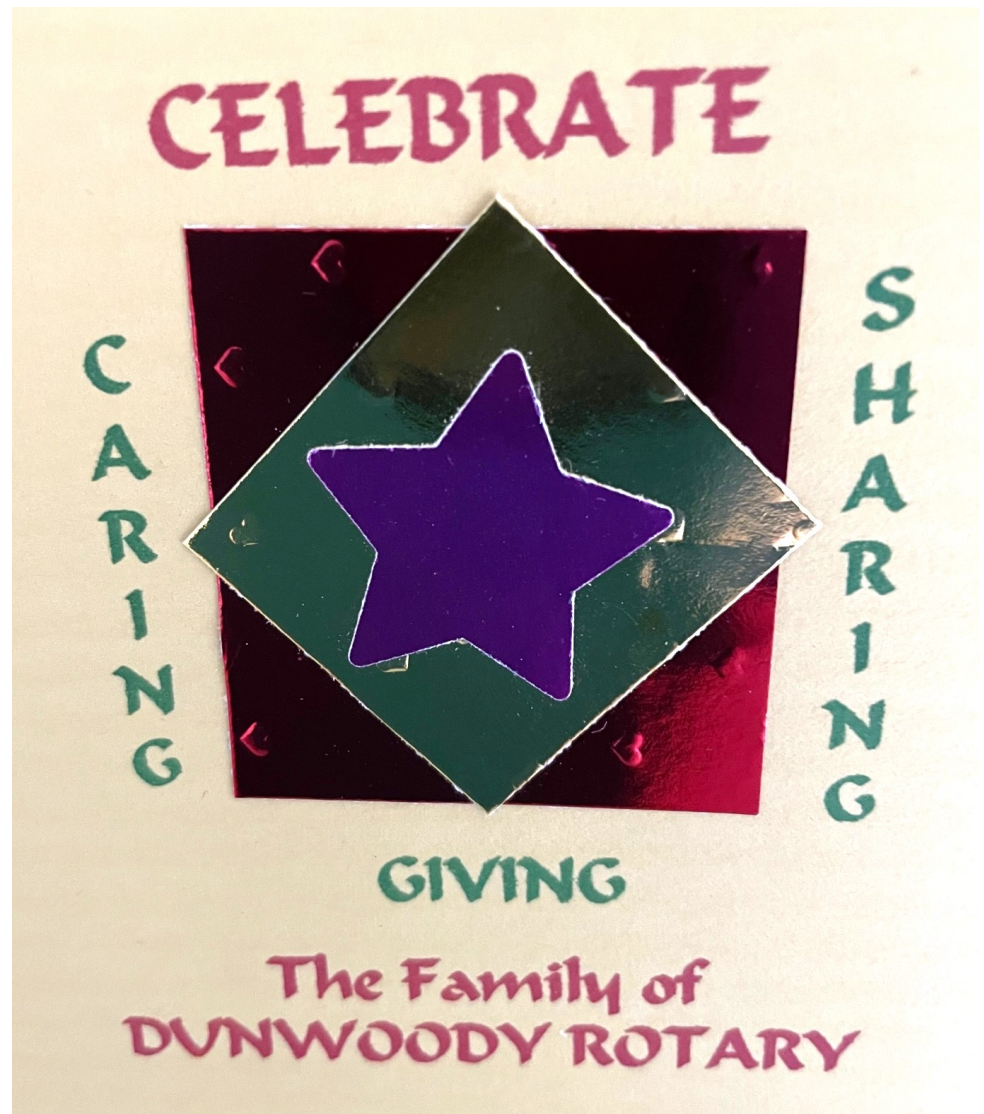
Service Opportunity **Ready, Set, Shop!**
