## Price Increases

To account for increasing costs, the price for lunch for guests has increased from \$15 to \$20 each, beginning at our first March meeting this year at the Plaza. Lunch for guests has been \$15 since 2022, but our costs for lunch have increased incrementally over that time.

Additionally, international and district Rotary fees have increased, but the Thomasville club has not increased dues since 2015. The board of directors is considering a dues increase to accommodate these higher dues and higher costs of living.
